


# Griffith Eng



Griffith Eng (1000ENG) is a two-year university course for Year 11 and 12 students which offers the opportunity for students to experience a university engineering course whilst completing their senior studies. Griffith Eng is a GUESTS At-School course.

## Benefits of completing Griffith Eng

### *Digital Badges*

All students who pass the course earn a Griffith Credentials GUESTS Achiever Badge.

### *Queensland Certificate of Education*

Queensland students will have their enrolment and grades recorded on their Queensland Certificate of Education. This does not count towards their ATAR calculation.

### *University credit transfer*

Students who pass the course will be eligible to receive 10 credit points for the equivalent course in a range of engineering undergraduate degree programs.

### *Adjusted selection rank*

Students who pass the course will be eligible to receive two (2.00) adjustments to their ATAR when applying for admission into eligible Griffith undergraduate degrees, as part of the Year 12 Subject Adjustment.

## Attendance

### Year 11 (Stage 1)

Stage 1, A Taste of Engineering, is offered to selected Year 11 students. Students will complete one of the challenges at home with the help of 2 x 1hour zoom lessons and then come on to campus to test their cars and complete other activities.

### Year 12 (Stage 2)

Stage 2 is offered in the first half (February to May 2023) of Year 12. Students will:

- attend weekly classes on campus
- complete the end of course assessment

## Course content

### Year 11 (Stage 1)

In Stage 1, students learn about what engineers do and the scope of the professions. In this stage there is a strong emphasis on teamwork with students working in small teams to complete hands-on activities, allowing them to 'taste' various engineering disciplines.

### Year 12 (Stage 2)

The content of Stage 2 introduces students to the engineering design process and professional aspects of being an Engineer. The course takes into consideration the increasingly complex interactions between engineering systems, project stakeholders and the environment, including the positive role of engineering in sustainable development as well as the potentially adverse impacts of engineering activities.

Students who successfully complete this course and choose to study Engineering at Griffith will receive full credit for Engineering Design Practice course (1022ENG).

## Admission criteria

If you would like to study GriffithEng you will need to complete an online application and provide your most recent School report. You will also need to obtain approval from your school (principal or guidance officer/careers adviser) and provide a completed Principal Approval form.

For admission into Year 11 (Stage 1) students must:

- be ATAR or Diploma of the International Baccalaureate eligible or meet one of the Non-ATAR or non-standard eligibility criteria as listed on the below website
- achieve a minimum grade of C (or equivalent passing grade) across all subjects, including a General or Applied English\*\* subject and Mathematical Methods, or equivalent interstate ATAR or IB Diploma subjects.

*Note: \*\*QCAA General English subjects that meet the English prerequisite include English, Literature, English as an Additional Language, English and Literature Extension. The QCAA Applied subject that meets the English prerequisite is Essential English.*

- have not failed or received an unsatisfactory in any subjects.

For admission into Year 12 (Stage 2), students must meet all eligibility criteria above, plus:

- successfully pass Stage 1 A Taste of Engineering.
