

The Department of Employment, Small Business and Training provides support to young Queenslanders to reach their full potential. If you want to grow your skills in preparation for your first steps into the workforce, this information may assist you. Our funding and support programs can help you start the journey that's right for you.

VET in schools (VETiS)

Vocational Education and Training in Schools (VETiS) is delivery of nationally recognised qualifications to school students in years 10, 11 and 12, and may count towards the Queensland Certificate of Education.

Funding is available for certificate I and II level qualifications that have been identified in consultation with industry, based on national skills shortages and Queensland Government priorities as those most likely to lead to employment

Free TAFE for under 25s

From 1 January 2021, Fee TAFE for under 25s will be available to eligible Queenslanders in 26 priority Certificate III qualifications available at TAFE Queensland and Central Queensland University only. Fee means Queensland Government will cover the full cost of training.

Free apprenticeships for under 25s

If you're under 25, find an employer to start an apprenticeship or traineeship, the Queensland Government will cover the cost of your training when you choose a high priority apprenticeship or traineeship. There are 139 priority qualifications offered under the program. You must commence, or be undertaking your training between 1 January 2021 and 30 September 2022.

Apprenticeships & Traineeships

Apprenticeships and traineeships combine training with working in a real job, with a real boss, for a real wage. Apprentices and trainees work towards the completion of a nationally recognised qualification while learning valuable skills at work either full time or part time and under the guidance of a training organisation

School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships

Students typically in years 10, 11 and 12, are trained in the workplace and with a training organisation, in their chosen apprenticeship or traineeship while continuing to study towards their Queensland Certificate of Education (Senior Certificate or equivalent).

Skilling Queenslanders for Work

Are you a Queenslander aged 15 years or older, no longer at school and need help to secure a job? Skilling Queenslanders for Work training projects help job seekers gain the skills, qualifications and experience you need to enter and stay in the workforce.

Certificate 3 Guarantee

The Certificate 3 Guarantee supports eligible individuals to complete their first post-school certificate III level qualification and increase their skills to move into employment, re-enter the workforce or advance their career.

Matching your skills to jobs
